Why newspapers? (and why not yet)

- Not meant to be preserved
- Stubborn, if not wicked material (paper, ink, fonts, layout, library binding, wrongly sorted or missing editions, ...)
- Sheer quantity is intimidating



- Reflects immediacy and fast pace of public discourse
- Covering (almost) every aspect of the world (global, regional, local news, culture, sports, science, politics, economy, advertising, obituaries, ...)
- Vast cross-domain interest



Further to content

- Defining metadata standards (images, texts, structural metadata, enrichments)
- Developing quality evaluation and prediction tools to estimate OCR and OLR results
- Defining aggregation and delivery mechanisms to transfer data from local providers to TEL and Europeana

The European Newspapers Browser

First Iteration:

- Basic text search
- Filtering of results by date, country, newspaper, language, library
- OCR results shown
- Zoom able version of full image
- Clickable links between full text and image (where possible)
- Link to newspaper source library


Second Iteration

- Added information about particular titles
- See what was published on a particular day
- Search over titles (not just text)
- Other browse-able visualisations of publication and library source
- Search / browse via entities






The European Newspapers Browser

A word about services

- Collection of texts = knowledge base
- Quality of texts and level of aggregation crucial for level of services
- Size matters big and small
- Open services to be customized by users
- Text search, search in structured texts, data mining (frequency analysis, semantic world field analysis, searches for "networks", geographical searches, …)
- Librarian ressources: islands of knowledge in an ocean of information
- Non-librarian ressources: the world as the world sees it
- Think visual!





Mind the gap: towards the contemporary

Challenges:

- Legal stuff (IPR, "personal rights")
- Business models and uncertainties

Options:

- Seek understanding with rights holders
- Cooperate with authors associations
- Cooperate with publishers (e.g. digitization projects)
